Talk to me.

Sing to me.

Let's talk, sing, read, write and play every day!



Talking to your child and giving them opportunities to talk helps them build vocabulary and increases their ability to describe events and tell stories.



Singing helps your child learn language, as it slows language down and allows children to hear and play with the smaller sounds in words.



Reading aloud is the single most important activity to boost reading success. Ask open-ended questions when reading, such as, "What do you think is going to happen next?"



Children learn about letters, words and stories when given the chance to try writing. Give your child blank paper and a thick crayon and encourage lots of scribble time! Talk to your child about what they are drawing and make up stories with them about their art.



Children learn a lot through play as it is a powerful way for them to use language and imagination. Provide plenty of play time for your child.





And dried up all the rain. (circle arms over head)


And the Itsy Bitsy Spider

Early Literacy Tip

sing for babies! Instead of doing the usual hand motions, crawl your fingers up their tummy to make the spider climb the spout, wiggle your fingers down their tummy to make the rain, and make a little circle around their belly button to make the sun shine.

If You're Happy and You Know It



If you're happy and you know it, clap your hands. (clap, clap)

If you're happy and you know it, then your face will surely show it. (point to your smile)


If you're happy and you know it, clap your hands. (clap, clap)

I Spy With My Little Eye

I spy with my little eye something that is yellow. (Child guesses what is yellow)

Additional ideas: You and your child can take turns spying and saying the rhyme. As your child gets a little older, switch to rhyming words, for example: I spy with my little eye something that rhymes with mat. (Child guesses cat!)



Early Literacy Tip - **TALKING:** This is a great game to play anywhere, anytime. By talking about rhyming words, you're teaching your child how to hear the smaller parts in words which makes it easier for them to learn how to read when it's time!



B-I-N-G-O

Early Literacy Tip - READING:

Use magnetic letters, foam letters, or simply write your own letters to spell out BINGO. As you sing the song, point to the letters. When you clap, remove or cover up the letter. Then bring them all out again at the end!


The Wheels on the Bus

The family on the bus says, "I love you."






Early Literacy Tip - PLAYING: This is a fun song to act out.

Pretend to be mama duck and her little ducklings going for a walk.

What do you see? What do you do?

Go on a duck adventure!

Early Literacy Tip - WRITING:

What does Row Your Boat have to do with writing? In order to be able to write, your child needs to have strong core muscles to sit up, balance, hold the paper, and hold the crayon. We're singing, getting exercise as we work our core muscles, and making it easier to learn how to write!

Zoom, Zoom, Zoom


Zoom, zoom, zoom, we're going to the moon (swish palms together - repeat 2x)






