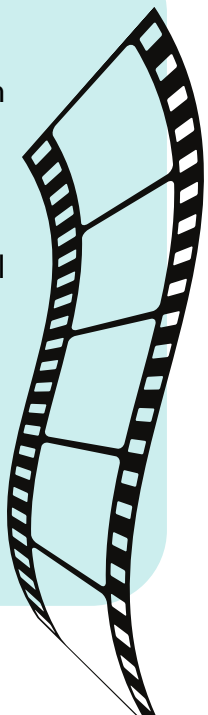
MEMORY LAB
