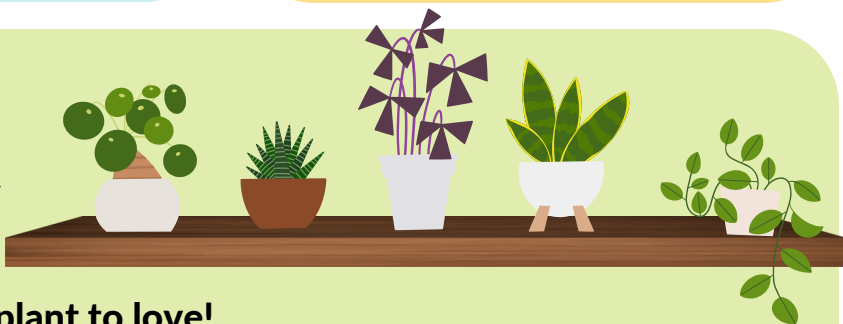

THE NEXT CHAPTER FONTHILL BRANCH



The \$4 million renovation has been split into two phases to allow the project to get underway as funds become available.

Phase One (\$1.5 million): Fully funded by the Town of Pelham, Phase One will begin in 2026. This phase includes a new accessible entrance, new washrooms, and a refurbished and expanded program room.

Phase Two (\$2.5 million): The second phase will include the installation of an elevator to open access to the basement and increase public space on the main level. Fundraising for Phase Two is ongoing. In October 2025, Paul and Bernadette Coyne made a leadership gift. In recognition, the future branch will be named the Coyne Family Branch. Thanks to early donations, only \$1.7 million remains to be raised to complete Phase Two.

THE NEXT CHAPTER VINELAND BRANCH

In spring 2025, \$2 million was awarded through the Green and Inclusive Community Buildings (GICB) federal fund toward a proposed 6,000-square-foot addition to the Rittenhouse Branch. This will be the first NetZero design-build in Lincoln. Community consultation will take place in 2026, with a goal of construction between 2027 - 2029.
