# Building Connections, Building Community

Renovations are upcoming in Fonthill and Vineland. Be part of the story as outdated spaces become accessible, flexible, and welcoming for everyone—from toddlers to seniors, students to lifelong learners.



A \$4 million, two-phase renovation will completely transform the Fonthill Branch. Phase One, fully funded by the Town of Pelham, will begin in 2026.

## PHASE ONE (\$1.5 million):

- Create a welcoming entrance with sliding automatic doors
- Update restrooms to meet accessibility standards, plus add a barrier-free, universal restroom
- Expand and enhance existing programming space

## PHASE TWO (\$2.5 million):

- Add 3,000 square feet of public space to a reconfigured main level
- Install a passenger elevator to the basement
- Expand and enhance program and meeting spaces through the branch
- Provide proper work areas to support staff workflow and service delivery

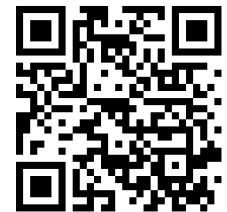
# **THE NEXT CHAPTER** EXPANDING THE VINELAND BRANCH

**Project Goals:**

- Add a 6,000-square-foot addition to the south, doubling the size of the branch
- Expand the scope of the facility to a community commons, including the relocation of the Friends of Lincoln’s History Archives
- Add energy-efficient upgrades, creating Lincoln’s first public Net-Zero building
- Remove accessibility barriers and provide proper work areas to support staff workflow, enhance service delivery, and optimize storage
